The current healthcare landscape in the UAE

CHALLENGES AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The roundtable discussion, Chaired by Dr. Ibtesam Al Bastaki, Director of Investment and Partnership, Dubai Health Authority (DHA), explored key points and statistics addressing the current state of healthcare in Dubai.

In addition to the points mentioned in the agenda, the discussion also focused on the crucial need for specialized care in paediatrics, OBGYN, and orthopaedics, considering the population age range of 16 to 65. Highlights of the discussion points are summarized as follows:

BED SHORTAGES AND DISCREPANCIES



A major concern highlighted was the shortage of hospital beds, revealing a significant gap between specialty availability and demand. The report emphasizes the urgency to address and fill this gap to meet the healthcare needs of the population.

FUTURE REQUIREMENTS AND CHANGING LANDSCAPE



The forum projected the requirements in the next 2 to 5 years, emphasizing the growing demand for mental health and rehabilitation care. Mainstreaming population health management was identified as a vital need to adapt to changing medical practices and bring functional and western medicine together.



PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS (PPP) POLICY



The report underscores the impact of Law 22, launched in 2015, which encouraged PPP in healthcare. Specific areas, such as dialysis, postacute healthcare management, physiotherapy, and rehabilitation centres, were handed over to private companies for management. The Cardiology Centre of Excellence stands as an exemplary PPP project, setting a regional benchmark.

MEDICAL TOURISM AND INNOVATION MODELS



Dubai's efforts in setting healthcare standards for medical tourism were acknowledged, especially in orthopaedics, cosmetic, dentistry, fertility, and upcoming rehabilitation and mental health services. The report highlights Dubai's push for innovation through accelerator programs, attracting Med-Tech startups to enhance healthcare practices.

WORKFORCE CHALLENGES AND SOLUTIONS



Several challenges concerning the healthcare workforce were discussed. These include retention of nurses, return on investment on capacity building, standardized salaries, licensing procedures, and the need for a clear career path. Suggestions were made to introduce incentives, golden visas, and a comprehensive plan to retain trained healthcare professionals.



DIGITAL HEALTH AND SMART HOSPITALS



The need for smart healthcare and hospitals was raised, with mentions of collaborations with entities like Dubai Integrated Economic Zones and Dubai Silicon Oasis. Digital health startups stressed the importance of engaging the population for effective population health management.

SUMMARY OF CHALLENGES AND CONCERNS

In summary, the attendees expressed concerns related to the need for extensive research, clarity in policies and governance, retention strategies for the workforce, fostering more Public-Private Partnerships, policies for mental health practitioners working with insurance companies, and streamlined licensing processes.

These issues collectively contribute to the challenges faced in the evolving healthcare landscape of Dubai. This comprehensive report aims to provide insights into the critical areas that demand attention and strategic planning for the enhancement of healthcare services in Dubai.
