The 2nd cycle of Dubai business Women Council (DBWC) Mentorship Programme 2019 has come to a successful conclusion on November 3rd 2019 at the Council's premises at the Dubai Chamber of Commerce and Industry. A panel discussion was held on the side-lines of the closing ceremony where mentors and participants highlighted the importance of developing and fostering female entrepreneurs' skills and expertise within the business community.

The 2nd cycle of the DBWC Mentorship Programme had an impressive growth of 89% compared to its 1st cycle in 2018. The #mentormedbwc six-months programme had paired 34 members with 34 mentors, who helped participants foster their skills, develop their expertise and assist in enhancing their competitiveness writhing the business community. Dubai Business Women Council calls on female Emirati and African entrepreneurs to establish ambitious joint projects and initiatives

During Raja Al Gurg's speech on the sidelines of the fifth edition of the Global Business Forum on Africa

H.E. Dr. Raja Al Gurg, President of Dubai Business Women Council (DBWC), required another period of dynamic coordinated effort between female business people in the UAE and Africa, featuring the closeness in cooperative energies between specialists in the two districts and the significance of attracting on these qualities to make aspiring undertakings and activities.

The call came during a discourse conveyed by Al Gurg at an occasion uninvolved of fifth edition of the Global Business Forum on Africa (GBF Africa 2019), organised by Dubai Chamber under the support of H.H. Sheik Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai. It was conveyed within the sight of Fatima Maada Bio, First Lady of the Republic of Sierra Leone and, just as a variety of Emirati and African women entrepreneurs.

During her discourse, H.E. Al Gurg underlined the fundamental job that female business people play in moving the business networks in their particular locales. This, she stated, enhances world economies with speculations and pioneering ventures which make employments and convey make significant walks crosswise over various enterprises, in this manner fuelling monetary development. Her Excellency expressed her pride in the noticeable job that women play in the UAE with help from the nation's astute initiative, which she said has gained astounding ground in guaranteeing sexual orientation equity at all levels and empowering ladies to take positions of authority crosswise over government and business fields.

Also, H.E. Al Gurg featured the basic job that Dubai Business Women Council (DBWC) plays in enabling women in Dubai and furnishing them with the aptitudes important to become corporate pioneers, effective business visionaries, and motivational role models.

Her Excellency stated that global participation has for quite some time been a significant concentration for DBWC as a component of its conviction that joint effort upgrades the trading of ability, drives business development and gives better yields. She noticed that the committee routinely has worldwide appointments visiting the UAE and gives its individuals access to worldwide markets through Dubai, which keeps on developing as a main worldwide business center point.

As far as it matters for them, the First Ladies of Sierra Leone and Liberia communicated their profound respect for Emirati women and female business people in Dubai and their accomplishments, featuring the dynamism and liveliness of the emirate's business atmosphere and the upper hands it offers to female business people. The First Ladies backed H.E. Al Gurg's call for expanding bilateral cooperation to achieve mutual goals.
